# Unwanted feline behaviors have a reason

Zsa Zsa Garage isn't a room in my house; she's my cat, and it seems with every passing day, I am getting a better understanding of her behaviors.

Behaviorists will tell you that "cats evolved independently, without the need for understanding social cues."

If they scratch the sofa and you yell at them and wave your arms, they just think you are about to attack, and they run for cover or give you that blank stare.

I'm sharing a few experiences I've learned over the years.

Carpet cleaning? Every couple of years, my husband and I would deep-clean the carpets. Each time we finished, as if on cue, both of our cats would lose their lunch in every single room.

Cats are very sensitive to smell, they were close to the ground, and the smell of the cleaner was literally making them sick.

Note to self: Send cat to the vet until the carpets are dry and then vacuum carpets before cat comes home.

**Bronchitis?** There was a lady who had a kitty that coughed all of the time.

The vet performed all kinds of tests, yet they could never find anything wrong. Then one day, her air freshener ran out, and she noticed the cat stopped coughing.

Think of all the different cleaning products we use, and our pets are down there on the floors.


**Litter-box problems?** Cats who have been poorly declawed can have issues of one type or another.

I met a cat who would bite anyone he perceived as a threat and sometimes had litter-box issues.

X-rays revealed that his declaw was poorly done, and he had leftover nail chips in his feet, causing him pain. His biting and poor litter-box habits were the only way he could ask for help.

There is always a reason for behaviors that are deemed unacceptable or confusing — you just have to look for the reason.


They have figured out I've had a home in the past, since I love the companionship of humans. I am so glad they are helping me find a wonderful new home.

Invitations will be sent out in January, and we hope you will bring your friends, family and your own Cupid to celebrate Valentine's Day with us.



#### Silent auction

Silent auction item donations should be new items and can be brought to StreetCats during business hours of 10:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday between Nov. 17 and Jan. 30.

Donations can be goods, services or gift cards to be auctioned off individually or used to complete a spectacular gift basket. We are always grateful for new and different items, which make for an exciting auction.

We would also love some big-ticket items, such as vacation packages, airline tickets, event tickets to concerts or sporting events, high-quality jewelry, etc. Please consider asking businesses to make a donation to us—it never hurts to ask!



We would also be happy to contact them directly if you prefer. We are a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, so **all donations are tax-deductible.** 

Please be sure to fill out a StreetCats donation form (available in StreetCats, or we'll email you one) when you bring in your items so we can value them for the auction and send a tax-deductible-gift letter.

It just wouldn't be right to have our auction without fabulous feline items, but we also realize our supporters are very diverse.

Please consider donations of non-cat items, items that are not gender-specific, or ones more valued by men. Please also know that while we try to use all donations, we may not be able to use everything donated because we have too many donations of one item (especially books and spa/bath products), items received too late to include in this year's auction, or lack of auction item space, while striving to offer a variety of auction items without undue repetition.

You may donate a completed basket, but please don't feel you must have a finished product. Contributions of various and even random items are great additions to our basket-making process. This comprises the majority of our donations, and we are well-equipped to utilize this type of contribution.

Please note that once we receive your donation, it becomes the property of StreetCats to use as we see fit.

If you want your donations returned if not used for 2016, please note this on your donation form when bringing your items to StreetCats. However, we promise your donations will always be used to further our cause, even if they are not used in the silent auction. # A word from our president

As the president of StreetCats, thank you to our generous donors for your ongoing support.

Without you, this organization could not continue to operate month to month as we have for the last 18 years.

As you know we, are 100% volunteers, and we exist on donations only, so expenses to keep us operating can be more than people realize. Our average total monthly expenses for 2015 through September 30 were \$9,482 and of this amount, monthly medical bills for both the kitties in StreetCats (\$1,917) and to pay only our portion for A Stitch in Time veterinary bills (\$1,458) averaged a total of \$3,375 monthly. It is easier to use than before and we will have the ability to keep it more current as we go forward with it.

# A Stitch in Time voucher program

Many of you have used our spay/neuter/vaccinate voucher program, A Stitch in Time, for homeless cats on the streets in your neighborhoods or at your businesses, and we think this is

The voucher program covers a spay or a neuter and a rabies vaccination.

We have kept the price of each voucher at \$20 so it would be affordable for you, but we have found that some people don't understand StreetCats pays the remainder of the veterinary bill for each service.

We have wonderful veterinary clinics that support our program, but they cannot provide their services free.

StreetCats pays the \$20 that was paid to us plus the balance of the costs incurred for every voucher that is redeemed.

If someone purchases vouchers but does not use them before they expire at the end of three months, the \$20 paid per voucher is a donation that helps us with our bills.

Not long ago, we had an in-

cident when someone who purchased vouchers from us was reselling them for more than the \$20 we charge.

This is not acceptable, because no one should make money off of our vouchers.

We have added a statement to the vouchers saying, "By signing below, you agree to the following guidelines in working with feral/stray cats and cat colonies, and you agree not to sell this voucher for monetary gain over the \$20 cost to another person."

In 2014, StreetCats paid an average of \$1,240 monthly above the \$20 paid to purchase each voucher, and as noted in the President's Letter, this year, our expenses through September are averaging \$1,458 above the \$20 paid.

We feel these expenses are well worth it to help reduce the population of unwanted cats and kittens on the streets.

We thank those of you who purchase these vouchers and the wonderful veterinarians who make this program possible.
